



### 2019 Button Design Winner - RYLEE GEE



The Tri-State Band Festival Committee annually selects a button design from submissions by student artists in the fine art and graphic art programs of Luverne High School.

We are proud to introduce the 2019 button design winner – Rylee Gee. Rylee created this award winning design during her sophomore year as a student in graphic arts.

Rylee and her family moved to Luverne about 2 years ago from Denver, CO to be closer to family and experience life in a small town. Her father, Ryan, is a pilot for Frontier Airlines and her mother's (Laura) career is in non-profit fundraising. Rylee's older sister graduated from Augustana last spring and is a nurse in the pulmonary unit at Sanford Sioux Falls. The family loves living in Luverne and Rylee takes every opportunity to be a part of new experiences like the Tri-State button design competition.

In designing the 2019 Tri-State Band Festival button, she reviewed 68 years of button design before determining to take her design a whole new direction by staying away from "marching images", and focusing more on creative new techniques in color. Rylee was thrilled to be notified that she submitted the winning design.

Rylee's interest in art extends to performance and many additional creative art forms. She participates in both the fall and spring plays and is a member of the concert choir where she is one of two Luverne students selected to participate in the Minnesota All State Choir which is scheduled to perform in February. Her interests in the creative arts include drawing, painting, metal, digital and pottery. Rylee is also excited to be selected as a member of the 2019-2020 CEO Class where she will learn about all aspects of business and management as a junior at Luverne High School.

Rylee enjoys physical activities and is a member of the Luverne Hockey Team and has a passion for lacrosse. 

With over 75 years of tradition, the NSU marching band was organized by Harvey Moen in 1941 and has remained an important ambassador for the Northern State University for over seven decades. Subsequent directors of the Marching Wolves include: Darwin Walker, John Lyon, Phillip Weinacht, Lonn Sweet, Dennis Dafoe, Eugene Perry, Alan LaFave, David Stern, Grant Manhart and Boyd Perkins. Currently the NSU Marching Wolves are under the direction of Terry Beckler with assistance from Travis Netzer, Jerome Letcher and Andrew Grandpre.

The Marching Wolves are known for their energetic style and powerful sound. In addition to performances at all NSU home football games, the Marching Wolves travel once a year to regional marching competitions. The Marching Wolves have been honored to march in two Presidential Inaugural parades and to represent South Dakota at the commemoration of the 65th and 75th anniversaries of the bombing of Pearl Harbor. The Marching Wolves are open to all students regardless of major.



### Dr. Terry Beckler

Dr. Terry Beckler is professor of percussion and associate director of bands at Northern State University in Aberdeen, SD. Previously, he was director of bands at Southwest Minnesota State University (Marshall, MN) and at Huron University (Huron, SD). He has 10 years of public school experience as band director for the Red Rock Central (Lamberton, Minn.) and Sioux Valley (Volga, S.D.) school districts. Dr. Beckler holds degrees from South Dakota State University, The University of Northern Colorado and The University of Minnesota.

Dr. Beckler has been a member of the 147th Army Band based in Mitchell, S.D., for more than 30 years. He enlisted in 1986 as a percussionist and, since 1998, has been commander/conductor of this group. In January of 2006, the 147th Army Band was awarded the Howard Citation of Musical Excellence from the John Philip Sousa Foundation. Dr. Beckler holds the rank of Chief Warrant Officer 5 and serves as the Army National Guard Deputy Senior Bandmaster. He is an active clinician in North Dakota, South Dakota and Minnesota and a former member of the Troopers Drum & Bugle Corps.

Students throughout the world benefited from talented musicians dedicating their lives to sharing their love for music and performance through teaching.

In selecting the 2019 TRI-STATE BAND FESTIVAL PARADE MARSHALS, the Tri-State Committee chose to honor MUSIC EDUCATORS – specifically past and present faculty from Luverne Public Schools. The festival is honored to present some of the current and former faculty from Luverne Public Schools to represent and honor music educators throughout the world. We thank every music educator for giving the gift of music to the student musicians. We know and believe that their impact on the life of each student enhances their existence in our world of sound and music.

opportunity to teach 4 years as junior high and elementary band instructor in the late 60's and early 70's with Tom Haugen. She considered Tom as a great mentor.

MARY GOHEEN: Mary taught for 29 years starting her career as music instructor in K-6 in the Magnolia School. In moving to Luverne, Mary touched the lives of many students which included - 5th & 6th classroom music, middle school band, high school band and middle school choir. Mary participated in many Tri-State Band Festivals directing the middle school band and serving as high school flag corps advisor. Some of her most memorable highlights included the two opportunities to direct the Middle School Band at the Minnesota Music Educators Convention, being selected as Luverne School District's Teacher of the Year and having the opportunity to teach with Dale Nelson.

TOM HAUGEN: Tom's career at the Luverne Public Schools spanned 1965 to 1971 as 5th through 12th grade band instructor. His duties included pep band, marching band, and solo/ ensemble. For two years, Tom served as chairman memories of his time in Luverne – "While there are many music highlights from my time in Luverne, one of my favorites was watching the students perform the baseball field show. I will never forget the positive crowd response to that show. We had so much fun! Thank you to the TSBF Committee for this honor. I truly believe that the TSBF is one of the very best band festivals around. The Luverne community has always given great support for music and I consider myself fortunate to have been able to have worked with the Luverne students and families, even for a short time."

DALE NELSON: Dale taught 5th grade band and high school band for 19 years in the Luverne School District. During those years he served as director of marching band, pep band, concert/symphonic band and jazz band. He provided thousands of lessons to instrumental students and directed hundreds of solo and ensemble groups. He recalls that his most memorable event from his career in Luverne was the opportunity that the Luverne High School Symphonic Band had to perform at the 2006 Music Educators

The TRI-STATE BAND FESTIVAL introduces you to this wonderful group of former music educators from the Luverne Public Schools:

BETH BEHAL: Beth taught for 10 years in the Luverne school system; 9 years as high school and junior high choir instructor and one year as 5th & 6th general music instructor. Her most vivid memory is from 2001 when she took the High School Choir to NYC where they had the opportunity to perform at St. Patrick's Cathedral and Carnegie Hall, a mere three months prior to 9/11. Beth also directed the prom committee and worked on the high school musicals.

ANN STAUFFER FILSRAND: Ann had the

of the negotiations committee for the LEA. In remembering his time at Luverne he concluded that: "All of the bands were excellent but the 1970 band was certainly special as they were the featured band at the MMEA Convention and the Dorian Band Festival at Luther College. The 1969 band stood out as they were chosen as the Minnesota Pep Parade WCCO Band of the Year."

JESSE MILLER: Jesse taught at the Luverne Public Schools from 2007 through 2010. During his career in Luverne he taught 5th grade music, high school band and gave lessons to instrumental music students in grades 5 through 12. He directed the high school marching band, jazz band and pep band. He shares fond

Convention in Minneapolis. Dale has always been dedicated to the Tri-State Band Festival as he began serving on the band festival committee in 1988 and continues to this day, making him the longest serving member of the TSBF Committee. This year Dale Nelson serves as chairman of the 2019 Tri-State Band Festival and works to maintain the festival's goal of providing a great marching band experience to student musicians.

PATTI NELSON: Patti shared her love for music for 9 years with the students of the Luverne Public Schools. During her career, she taught kindergarten music, 5-8 grade music and directed the 6th grade choir. She loved the opportunity



to teach guitar classes to middle school students and remembers that Performance Day demonstrations in general music were among her fondest memories.

RICHARD OWEN: Richard spent six very busy years at the Luverne Public Schools, resigning in the spring of 2018 to accept a new teaching challenge. His teaching demands included 6th grade band, 7th & 8th grade band, high school band, middle & high school jazz band, pep band, marching band and middle school band lessons. He was also involved as an advisor for the prom committee. Richard shares: "Some of my best memories were the opportunities that student performers had to share their talent by performing in events like the Buffalo Days Parade and at places like Pizza Ranch, Minnesota Veterans Home and Mary Jane Brown Home. Always a highlight was performing for the hometown crowd during the Tri-State Band Festival. Each performance allowed students to see how music is supported by the community."

BRUCE PHELPS: Bruce spent five years with the Luverne Public Schools music programs. During his time in Luverne from 1970 through 1976, Bruce taught junior high general music to grades 7 & 8, directed the 9th grade choir and the high school concert choir. Through the years he provided countless voice lessons to students of all ages and enjoyed working on musicals and concert performances. He shares these special memories of his time in Luverne: "The Luverne choir was invited to perform at the Minnesota Music Educators Convention in February of 1976. I enjoyed 5 years of working with outstanding

students, great staff and enjoyed the wonderful support of the Luverne community. I have many fond memories of the folks with whom I worked. It was a great way to start my teaching career!"

MYRNA NORTON PHELPS: Myrna dedicated the 27 years of her teaching career in Luverne educating elementary/middle students. She taught and directed vocal music and general music to grade K-6. She enjoyed every opportunity to take her classes into the community to perform, particularly holiday caroling programs for seniors. Myrna shares: "In April of 1992 the Luverne Elementary 3rd & 4th graders presented a program called "A Prairie Home". We learned a lot about the history of Luverne and Rock County. Our program was awarded the Excellence in History Curriculum in 1994 by the Minnesota Historical Society. What wonderful memories I have of students and staff at the Luverne Elementary School. I was blessed to be part of the beginning musical experiences of many students in the Luverne system."

DOLLY TALBERT: Dolly loved to share her love with music with the students at Luverne Public Schools. She taught in the district for 24 years teaching elementary music, middle school general music, high school music theory, middle school choir, high school treble choir and high school mixed choir. Along with a very busy teaching career, Dolly chaired the music department, directed high school musicals and worked on the Music Department's Winter Carnival (a fund-raiser she started to support instrumental and vocal music). Dolly shares fond memories from her teaching career: "I

was deeply honored to be selected as MMEA Educator of the Year for Choir in 1992, LEA Teacher of the Year in 1989 and LEA Friends of Education in 2001 for working in a field I loved. I shared great times with students and parents during our choir trips and at contests. It was my pleasure to work in a community that is so supportive of the music program."

BOB VANMAASDAM: Music has filled Bob's life and he enjoyed the opportunity he had from 1972-1973 to teach in Luverne directing the Senior High Choir and teaching junior high general music. He recalls: "Two special memories stand out from my time in Luverne. One would be the musical "Li'l Abner" and the opportunity to work with the amazing students in the cast and crew. I directed the pit orchestra for the Overture, Entr'acte and Exit music. Second was the opportunity to plan in the 'rock band" which included Doug Kraayenhof as lead singer, Shawn Doughtery on drum set, Dave Engebretson on guitar and Jim Bierkamp on bass guitar. As has been true throughout my career, I really appreciated my music colleagues: Dolly Talbert (choir), Ed Norris & Scott Shelstad (band) and Myrna Norton (elementary). After my year in Luverne, I taught junior high vocal music at Red Wing from 1973-1994 which included a oneyear sabbatical at UNC in Greeley, CO to earn my master's degree, I married Sherril Buseman (English teacher at LHS from 1972-1979) in 1979 and we celebrated our 40th wedding anniversary this summer. We left Red Wing to return to our farm in SWMN when our two children were young. I am now in my 23rd year of teaching music at Red Rock Central in Lamberton, MN, where we've especially enjoyed putting on major musicals each fall for the past 15 years."
