

September 25, 2010 TRI-STATE BAND FESTIVAL

On October 6, 1951 the first high school band marched down Main Street to compete in the first TRI-STATE BAND FESTIVAL. Sixty years later, the competition continues to be the premiere high school marching event of the

The Luverne High School Marching Band of 1951-1952 was the first band to march down the streets. They ushered in a tradition of fellowship and marching band education that continues today.

tri-state area.

In 1951, six community leaders banded together to form a committee and recruit bands for a fall marching band competition. Dr. G. N. Getman (optometrist), Ferd Luebke (Tri-State Insurance Company), Ken Getman (optician), Dr. Robert W. Keitel (optometrist), Lloyd Herreid (clothier) and Norman Johnson (Bell Telephone Company) became that band of brothers who developed the first competition.

The mission of the Tri-State Band Festival was to develop a competition for high school marching bands that would provide them with an opportunity to learn, develop and showcase their marching band skills. This mission remains as the foundation of the Tri-State Festival!

Eleven bands competed in their respective classes in this adjudicated festival. Bands marched down Main Street to give the public a

taste of the competition to come. The parade was not judged but following the parade, twirlers competed in a separate morning event. In the afternoon, hoards of people crowded the grandstand at the Rock County Fairgrounds to watch the field competition. The judges were Bill Greene (Buena Vista), Frank Piersol (lowa State) and Earl Erickson (Gustavus Adolphus) who provided written commentaries for the bands. The event ended with a massed performance piece by the bands. Trophies were presented to the top bands. The first trophies were presented to Pipestone, Sheldon and George.

In 1958, Tri-State introduced live recorded comments on reel to reel recorders. Although cumbersome, this new method enhanced the information and education the bands received about their performances. Taped comments were mailed to the bands several weeks after the competition as volunteers painstakingly spliced comments together to provide a complete picture to the bands.

By the 1960's the competition had grown from 11 bands to 20 bands. Adjudication and classification changed when bands were categorized by 10-12 enrollment numbers. The parade and field events became increasingly competitive as new methods and processes were introduced. The biggest disaster of the

60's happened in 1965 when torrential rains cancelled the festival.

The competitions of the 1970s brought larger bands traveling from long distances to the Festival. Judges comments began to be recorded on cassettes which provided the opportunity for band directors to receive comments immediately following the competition. Band students filled the town as the competition brought up to 29 bands into the community.

As additional festivals were established throughout the region, the Tri-State Committee established a permanent date for the Band Festival in 1975. From that time forward, the last Saturday in September has been designated as the date for the Tri-State Band Festival.

1979 elevated Tri-State competition to a whole new category when the Tri-State Band Festival established the policy to hire only certified judges from the Association of Marching Band Judges.


Crowds of people lined the streets of Luverne for the 1980 Tri-State Band Festival. That year, the community invited the USMC Drum and Bugle Corps from Washington, DC to offer clinics and performance demonstrations for the bands and attendees. People from throughout the region enjoyed the standard of excellence this professional parade and marching band.

Over the next years, guest bands continued to delight Festival-goers on the day of the event. SDSU Marching Band, SDSU Drumline, U of M Percussion Line, 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing Band, Brassworks, SSU Marching Band, 1st Marine Division Marching Band, USM Marching Coyotes, Iowa State University Cyclone Marching Band, and Northern State Marching Band.

The following thirty years of competition have seen the advent of more complex drills, arrangements, instrumentation and music. Directors provide students the opportunity to develop strategic inter-active and themed performances that delight and awe the public.

The Tri-State Band Festival Committee continues to work throughout the year to maintain the great tradition of this festival. It is the dedication and inspiration of every community volunteer who works throughout the year to make this one day possible. Tri-State Band Festival Saturday continues to be one of the proudest days of the year for Luverne, MN!





Tri-State's biggest fan and most ardent supporter passed away on Monday, August 30th at the age of 91. Lucille Getman supported her husband Ken as he conceived and organized the first Tri-State Band Festival sixty years ago. She proudly watched her children, "adopted" children and "adopted" grandchildren march down the street and on the field.

Every year she grew more and more amazed at the creativity and complexity of performance and sound. The K. M. Getman Award not only commemorates Ken's dedication to Tri-State...it also symbolizes Lucille's. Since the first year this trophy was presented, Lucille Getman offered her hand in congratulations to the winner. It was only last year that she wasn't able to celebrate the day with us. 2010 Tri-State Band Festival Parade Marshals **Luverne High School Marching Band** 1951-1952

Today, the Tri-State Band Festival celebrates 60 years of high school marching band competition.

Through the efforts of local businessmen who wanted to create a community event that would have purpose and benefit for youth; Bob Keitel, Ken Getman, Ferd Luebke and Lloyd Herreid came up with the idea of promoting marching bands. When other community civic organizations focused on celebrations promoting plants and animals, these men decided that the best way to promote Luverne was to promote something of value to youth.

In the aftermath of WWII, the sounds of military marching bands and parades were an important part of each community. The idea to celebrate this proud heritage through a high school marching band competition was born. The festival garnered its name from the tri-state marker located in the corner of Rock County, Minnesota; Lyon County, Iowa; and Minnehaha County, South Dakota. The men set their goal to recruit marching bands from all three states.

Can you imagine the excitement that high school students felt on that Saturday morning in 1951 when eleven marching bands lined up for that first parade? The instruments were shined to perfection. Every uniform had a stiff crease. Hats were perfectly positioned on each head. Batons were decorated to the hilt. All

eyes looked forward. Feet marched in perfect step. Anticipation and excitement were everywhere!

That first festival set the standard of performance for years to come. The Tri-State Band Festival is honored to welcome the Luverne High School Marching Band

of 1951-1952 who serve as parade marshals for this year's festival. These men and women were members of the first band who marched down the street sixty years ago under the direction of Carl E. Christopherson.

AWARDS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS: The Luverne High School Band has performed 60 years in the Tri-State Band Festival. In 2009, The Luverne High School Marching Band took 2nd place at the Waseca Marching Classic, the Big Sioux Review and the Dutchmen Marching Championship. They took 1st place in the parade competition and 3rd in the field competition at the Sioux Falls Festival of Bands, as well as hosting the Tri-State Band Festival. Throughout the year, they were also awarded multiple Outstanding Guard, Outstanding Hornline, outstanding Drum Majors and People's Choice Awards.
